- **Colonial Michilimackinac** – Explore this reconstructed 1715 French fur-trading village which features re-enactments from British 1770s occupation and the American Revolution era.
- **Historic Mill Creek Discovery Park** – Witness the power of the creek harnessed to cut timber into lumber at one of the oldest industrial sites on the Upper Great Lakes. Enhance your experience with the **Adventure Tour** – Trek through the treetops on the Adventure Tour! This special, guided nature experience takes visitors over the Forest Canopy Bridge, down the 425-foot Eagle's Flight Zip Line, and up the five-story Treetop Discovery Climbing Wall.
- **Mackinac Island Round Trip Ferry** – Travel across the waters to idyllic Mackinac Island, where cars are prohibited and travel is done by horse, bicycle or on foot.
- **Horse Drawn Carriage Tour of the Island** – Discover this historic isle and legendary points with a narrated historic and scenic carriage tour through the island. Included is a stop at the Arch Rock. A beautiful natural limestone formation, one of the most photographed spots on Mackinac Island.
- **Tour Fort Mackinac** – The cannon blasts, the rifles fire, the soldiers march and history comes alive. Constructed by British soldiers during the American Revolution, the fort served as a sentinel in the Straits of Mackinac for 115 years. Inside the stately stone walls it's a different time. The oldest building in Michigan and 13 other historical structures boast exhibits explaining everything from military training and battles to medical treatments to family life within the fort.
- **2-hour Bike Rental** – Discover the island at your own pace with your friends. Enjoy some free time for shopping in the village and don't forget to sample **Mackinac's world famous fudge**.





- **Student Science Scavenger Hunt** – This is a different way to learn about Michigan’s history. Students will be asked to search for items that native Americans would have collected years ago. By identifying certain trees, rocks, and other items common to the Straits Area, your students will forge an in-person link to their studies. This is great way to take the classroom outdoors.

- \* **Haunted History Tours** – Ghostly happenings on the Island? Some say...indeed. Cloaked tour guides escort “spirited guests” through the streets of Mackinac Island and frequently stop to tell an eerie tale of the Island’s many specters and legends as well as the history behind each location.
- \* **Legendary Grand Hotel luncheon Buffet** – Sumptuous, savory, a delight for the eyes and palate. This is definitely one of the highlights of Mackinac Island and of the Grand Hotel experience. It features, hot and cold entrees, seafood, garden-fresh salads, assorted cheeses, selection of meats, pastries and so many dessert and treats.
- \* **Icebreaker Mackinaw Maritime Museum** – Visit the US Coast Guard Icebreaker known as the “Queen of the Great Lakes”. Participate in hands-on activities at various stations around the ship where students will learn about ice-breaking, knot tying, maritime history, seamanship and more!
- \* **Butterfly Conservatory** – Discover this all-glass conservatory with beautiful lush plants with hundreds of butterflies. Observe these fascinating creatures as they fly within a specially designed butterfly greenhouse.
- \* **Jack Pine Lumberjack** – The show educates the audience in the rich history of Michigan’s logging past. It is fast paced, up-beat and keep the audience involved. It demonstrates the skills of lumberjack including chopping, sawing, axe throwing, cross-cut sawing and logrolling.
