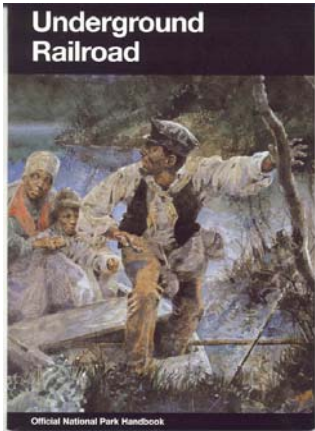




African American Heritage

- In Detroit tour **Motown Historical Museum**, long known as Hitsville USA. This museum is home to the world-famous Studio A, where the Temptations, Marvin Gaye, and many others recorded with the Funk Brothers.
- Visit **John Freeman Walls Historic Underground Railroad Museum**. This Family Museum was built and is operated by the descendants of John Freeman Walls and Jane King Walls. They traveled on the famous Underground Railroad from Rockingham County, North Carolina to Canada.
- **Uncle Tom's Cabin**. This site commemorates the life of Reverend Josiah Henson and his contributions to the famous Underground Railroad.
- **Buxton Historic Site and Museum**, this site depicts the stories of the Underground Railroad and the successes of the early settlers in the community that they built..
- **North American Black Historical Museum** Situated in the midst of the original Black settlement in Amherstburg, the Centre was built to preserve Black history and promote community and cultural activities
- **Buffet lunch** at a Tropical Greenhouse Restaurant. Enjoy your buffet lunch and then wander through this amazing collage of interesting things to see and do.
- **First Baptist Church**. Founded in 1841 by fugitive slaves. The American abolitionist John Brown held a "convention" in Chatham. The meetings during May 1858 were to plan the raid on Harper's Ferry, Virginia to liberate the slaves in the USA.
- **Museum of African American History**, this 22-gallery multimedia experience where visitors walk through reproductions of a marketplace in Benin, a slave dungeon and a slave ship, a rice plantation's slave quarters and more.
