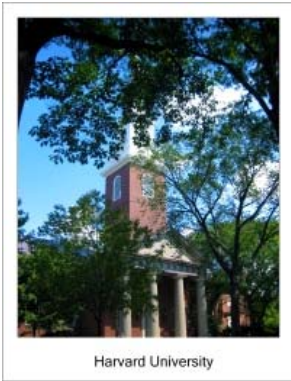




Boston

- Free time at **Quincy Market and Faneuil Hall**

- **Plimoth Plantation** - as it was in the 17th century, a unique living history experience
- **Plymouth Rock:** Sometimes called the Cornerstone of the Nation, Plymouth Rock is one of the most widely-known historical landmarks in the United States.
- **Jenney Grist Mill** on the site of the original mill built by Pilgrim John Jenney. Step back in time as you enter the doors of the 1636 mill.
- Visit the **Mayflower II** - This 16th century ship is not the original, long since lost. Mayflower II is a well-researched replica, built from the same Devon oak in Brixham, England.
- **Pilgrim Hall:** This stately museum is the headquarters of the Pilgrim Society. Built in 1824, it houses the actual possessions of the Pilgrims, including Myles Standish's swords, the "great chairs" of Governor Bradford and Elder Brewster, one of the original Pilgrim hats (the only one in existence) and the only painting of a Mayflower passenger, Edward Winslow.
- In Boston, **guided tour of the city** featuring many famous sites including parts of Boston's Freedom Trail - Copps Hill Burying Ground, North Church, Beacon Hill, Boston Common, Old State House, Faneuil Hall and Quincy Market.
- **USS Constitution Museum** - bringing to life the stories of the individuals who authorized, built, served on and preserved USS *Constitution*.
- **Tour Old Ironsides**, the oldest commissioned warship afloat in the world. Her history is rich and colorful and 200 years strong -- from fighting Barbary pirates on the "shores of Tripoli" to winning famous victories during the War of 1812.
- **Paul Revere House** guided tour - a national historic landmark, it is downtown Boston's oldest building and one of the few remaining from an early era in the history of colonial America.
- Visit **Cambridge – Harvard University**, drive by **Bunker Hill Memorial**

- A stop in **Salem** explores the scene of the famous **Salem Witch Trials**. Tour the Salem Witch Museum – go back to Salem 1692.
- Then tour the **House of Seven Gables** for an unforgettable historical experience. Outside, spectacular seaside gardens await you. Built in 1668, this is the oldest surviving 17th century wooden mansion in New England.
